Key Verses:

- 1 Corinthians 7:3-5 Sexual desire are not bad, it is a gift from God for marriage
- 1 Corinthians 10:32 Do not cause anyone to stumble
- 1 Corinthians 10:23 "Permissible" actions are not always "beneficial"
- 2 Timothy 2:22 Flee impurity, pursue righteousness
- 2 Corinthians 10:5 Our "thought-life" must be addressed
- 1 Timothy 4:12 Our goal is to set an example

Key Facts:

- 27 million households of individuals living alone, 25 million households of families in the US
- More abuse occurs in cohabitation than in marriage
- 70% divorce rate among couples who live together before marriage
- Promise Keeper's survey: 50% of men viewed pornography within the last week
- Predictors sexual satisfaction in marriage (in women)
 - o Married, monogamous, deeply religious, protestant

electronic devices (iPod, iPad, smartphones), video games, commercials, billboards, TV shows, social media (eg. Facebook), sexual conversations	lust	course joking, flirting, masturbation, inappropriate touching, foreplay, vaginal intercourse

Definition of Purity: Fleeing any input, thought or action that elicits a desire that is not fulfilled by or directed toward your spouse.

- 1 Corinthians 6:18 "Flee immorality"
- Immorality: *Porneia* also translated as "fornication" and involves a wide range of sexual practices

The Senses:

- Sight
 - o Men are primarily stimulated visually
 - o Implications for men: more prone to sin in this area
 - o Implications for women: 1) more effort needed to dress modestly 2) more often struggle with appearance issues
- Touch
 - O Question for you: If she was married, would her husband be concerned?
 - O What do your actions communicate to others, or your future spouse?
 - Violating boundaries before marriage = violating boundaries after marriage
 - O Women must communicate disapproval, men must listen
- Hearing
 - O Conversations may increase the risk of impurity
 - Sexual conversation → thoughts → actions
 - O Regardless of the senses, the time of day is important: Nothing good usually happens after 10 PM

The Plan:

- Set rules
 - o "Nothing below the neck, under a blanket, or lying down. It's just too hard otherwise."
 - o Both the man and the woman must take responsibility
 - Women: Don't advertise what is not for sale
 - Men: Love involves not putting someone in a compromising situation
 - o Understand condemnation versus conviction. (Romans 8:1; John 16:8)
- Remove expectations
 - o A woman should be pursued for her and not what can be exchanged physically
 - o Practice sowing and reaping
- Made hard decisions
 - o Purity is more important than convenience
 - O Purity is more vital than false security in relationship
- Be tenaciously accountable
 - O Good idea: Ask your pastor, small group leader for their thoughts before dating
 - These people have YOUR best interests in mind!
 - O Ask your small group to ask YOU the tough questions
- Focus on fun activities, friendship, and preparation
